
This week we have just been working so hard that I cannot do anything except tell you about all the fabulous learning that has taken place.




Reception have had lots of fun riding on the balance bikes in the Outside Classroom! They have learned how to get on and

off them safely, how to use the

brake to stop and even practised gliding!







Year 1 have been using drama to learn the story of 'Little Red Riding Hood' and have

written some superb descriptions (using adjectives) of the characters and the setting.

They then went onto retell the story using connectives. I was absolutely amazed at their writing.



Well done Year 1!
Year 2 have been learning that division is the inverse of multiplication in maths, using arrays to help generate relating calculations. They have also learnt to draw pictorial arrays to help them answer multiplication word problems.



In English, Year 2 have been learning to use similes to add extra detail when describing characters and in Topic they have been lucky enough to have had two visitors, known as Violet and Indigo,

come to their classroom with sparkly fair dust. They have written to the children asking for them to design them a new house so they can live in the KS1 learning area. Soon, Year 2 will be



writing back to them with a few questions. A busy week!

Year 3 have made informative videos about



different skeleton types, vertebrates and invertebrates. The children also identified animals with certain skeleton types and ordered them

based on this. They also looked at their bodies and researched the bones they have.

In Science, the Year 4s have been investigating and making simple circuits. They have drawn circuit diagrams to show,



and help explain what they have learned.



Our fantastic Year 5 pupils have made their own amazing, moving model solar systems! Can you tell which planet is which?



Year 6 have been working so hard. They have been practising their reading comprehension skills using longer texts (Giant's

Necklace) and in topic, they have been imagining they have woken up in the Stone Age, without clothes or possessions, hungry, tired and thirsty. They had to work in groups to order pictures of various actions, e.g. make a tool, find firewood, find water, ranking them by importance and explaining why they

have chosen that order. Good problem solving!

I'm so proud of the children and

the effort and resilience shown in their learning so far this term. Resilient Rosie would be very proud too.

Finally, I must say good luck to Nula, Lexi, Mary and Katy, who are taking the next step towards their aspirations to be gymnasts. They are representing Alford in the Primary School Gymnastics Competition this weekend in Grantham. We wish them the best of luck!
