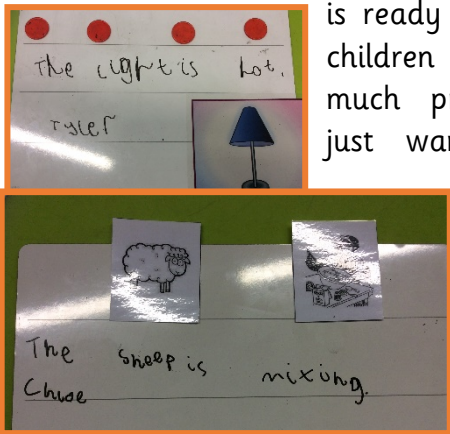

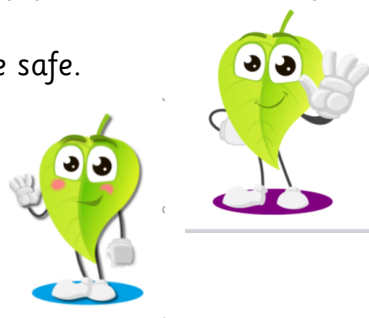
Also, this week, we received a certificate thanking us for the £506 raised for Children in Need last term.

Parking in Hanby Lane

A parent of a child at Alford Primary, who is a resident in Hanby Lane, has asked us to pass on her concerns about the fact that she struggles to park in front or anywhere near her own home when returning in time to collect her child from school.

Please could I urge parents **not** to use Hanby Lane when collecting and delivering children to school. As you can probably appreciate it is very frustrating for residents when they are unable to park within the vicinity of their own homes.

As you know, you can park in the overview car park at the rear of the library (over the bridge) for FREE all day, or you can obtain a permit from school to park free for 30 minutes at each end of the school day.

If you don't have much time in the morning, you can always drop your child off at the walking bus in the school car park in Farlesthorne Road and they will be escorted up to school by a member of staff. You do not need to book your child on the walking bus- just turn up!
