Autumn Term

During the Autumn Term you will be invited into school for an individual chat with your child's class teacher. This will give you an opportunity to find out more about how your child will be learning and also to talk about how your child is settling in. More information will be available in September.

Lunchtime

In EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2, your child's hot lunch is funded as part of the Universal Infant Free School Meal Scheme. John Spendluffe canteen cook our school lunches each day and you will be able to pick from a choice of two hot lunches and 2 dessert options each day. Your child can bring a packed lunch if you prefer this option.

Breakfast Club

Why not join our Breakfast Club for a great start to the school day? We offer a variety of nutritious breakfasts, including a choice of cereals, toast, fruit and yoghurts, available daily, and a cooked breakfast option that varies daily. Your child will be supervised by members of our staff and escorted to school in time for registration. Our Breakfast Club is open from 7:45am every day, in term time only. This a pre-book and pay in advance service which is split into two sessions; the first session is for if your child attends from 7.45am and costs just £2. The second session is for if your child attends from 8:15am, which only costs £1. Booking forms are available from the office to fill out and return.

After School Club

We are pleased to offer after-school provision from 3:15pm - 5:30pm at a cost of £5 per session. There are a maximum number of 20 places available. Two teaching assistants will run each session overseen by Senior Management.

The sessions are held in the mobile classroom and a snack and drink is provided. However, children are welcome to bring their own snack. Children will also have access to the school hall and the outdoor area. If you would like your child to attend this provision, please enquire with the school office as to availability and to complete a permission slip. It runs on a first come first served basis, sometimes last minute places are available.

Walking Bus

The walking bus service allows you to "drop and go" in the car park. Your children will meet Mrs Teanby at the car park gates of the school car park at 8:35am.

They will be registered and walk up at 8:45am to be in the playground for 8:50am ready for school.

Mrs Teanby is happy to pass on messages and any dinner money.

Uniform

Your child will need to wear:

- a maroon jumper or cardigan;
- a blue or white shirt, blouse or polo shirt;
- black or grey trousers, skirt or dress;
- black, grey or white socks or tights;
- sensible low heel school shoes, no trainers please.

Please be aware that jewellery should not be worn other than if children have pierced ears. In this circumstance, studs are allowed. Nail varnish should not be worn.

Your child will also need a:

- bag containing a set of spare clothes to be kept in school on his/her peg;
- pair of wellies, which need to stay at school all year;
- warm waterproof coat with a hood.

Please ensure that **all** clothing is clearly labelled with your child's name - including shoes.

We start P.E. (Twinkle Toes) later in the academic year. There is no need to buy P.E. kit until later in the year. We will give you plenty of notice before we start our Twinkle Toes sessions.

We will provide your child with a school book bag once they have started.

A huge part of our EYFS curriculum
is learning outside. We do this in all
weathers: come rain or shine!

At home you can help your child by...

- ensuring he/she can use the toilet properly and flush it. We expect all children to be toilet trained before they start school and to be able to manage their own personal hygiene. This means not only being out of nappies, but also being able to use the toilet independently.
- encouraging your child to dress and undress themselves. Please send your child to school in clothes that they can undo or do up by themselves. Shoes with velcro straps are ideal.

When talking to your child about school and their new teachers, please pass on positive feelings about your child starting school, even though you may be feeling anxious yourself

If your child attended a nursery or pre-school then you will be familiar with the special book that celebrated your child's learning experiences during their time at the setting.

At Alford Primary School we create individual learning journals for each child using our online learning journal program called Tapestry. These record your child's achievements and progress.

You will be able to view and contribute to your child's special Learning Journal through a unique password that we will create for you. You will then be able to freely access all of the lovely photographs, videos and quotes showing your child learning through play.

Your child's special Learning Journal builds the story of all of the things that your child can do and is learning to do during their time with us in the Early Years Foundation Stage.

We will hold Parent Workshops early in the Autumn Term to demonstrate how to use Tapestry at home.

Please make sure that your child arrives for the start of the school day and that you pick them up promptly at 3.15pm. Missing the start of the session can unsettle your child and being late to pick them up is likely to make them anxious.

Our first priority is the safety of your child. As an extra safeguarding measure, if someone else is to collect your child from school, please tell us in advance, giving us a password that is also known by the person collecting your child.

ABSENCE

If your child is absent for any reason, please let the school know before 9.30am on that morning.

Please note that we have a **48-hour** policy for a bout of sickness or diarrhoea.

UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE

The law states that parents do not have the automatic right to take their child out of school for holidays during term time. All schools have received clarification from the Department of Education about children taking holidays during term time. As of September 2013, **Headteachers are not able to authorise any holiday** requests during school time.

If for any reason you need to take your child out of school during term time then you will need to collect a leave of absence form, (at least 2 weeks prior to the date), from the office and return it completed. The Headteacher will then respond to you in writing about your request.

FIRST AID & INJURY

We have named members of staff who hold a Paediatric First Aid Certificate, and have received instruction specifically covering the administering of first aid to infants and children. All accidents are entered on an Accident Report form which will be signed by both a member of staff and countersigned by the person collecting the child.

If your child has had a physical injury out of school, please see a member of the EYFS Team on arrival to school so that the Pre-Existing Injury Form can be completed.
