Absence from School

If your child is absent from school due to sickness, or any other reason, we must be informed before **8.45am** on the first day of absence and **everyday thereafter**. If your child is suffering from diarrhoea or vomiting, they cannot be in school until

48 hours after the last bout of the illness. Please report your child's absence on the school answering machine or via ParentHub, explaining the reason for absence.

Attendance

A reminder that children are expected to be in school. Unauthorised absence is being closely monitored and will result in a fine by the local authority if it exceeds set limits. We will let you know if you are getting close to these limits by letter.

Uniform

The children have come back looking lovely and smart for the new year. However, a reminder that children should be in school skirts, school trousers or school shorts. Please do not send your child in tracksuit bottoms, leggings or casual shorts unless this has been discussed with the class teacher. Thank you for this.

Morning Crush

In the morning, could I ask that parents either leave the playground **before** the classes come in, or **wait** for the classes to come in and then exit the playground. Some of our smallest children are losing sight of their teacher as parents cut across the line.

Park and Stride

Could I respectfully remind parents that, for the safety of children who walk or cycle to school, we discourage parking in Finsbury Street and Hanby Lane. Parking in JTSC carpark is strictly off limits.

We are very lucky to have a Park and Stride facility at the bottom of Hanby Lane. You can either park free in the overflow car park at the back of the Library (and you can then walk through the gate into Hanby Lane) or alternatively you can get a permit from the office which allows you to park free in the main library car park between 8.45am - 9.15am and 3.00pm - 3.30pm whilst delivering or collecting your child.

Walking Bus

We continue to provide the walking bus service. Mrs Teanby will meet parents in the usual place (the visitors' car park) at **8.45am** and a register will be taken.
