#### **CORONAVIRUS UPDATE**

It has been a time of uncertainty in education recently, with speculation as to when school opening will be affected by Covid-19 (Coronavirus). Yesterday, the Prime Minister announced that schools in the UK will not be closing and only trips abroad should be cancelled. With this news, in school, we will carry on as normal.

Parents have asked about other trips. We will be reviewing guidance for local/national trips daily - to keep abreast of any new developments, however, until we hear otherwise, we will not be cancelling these. We will be putting in extra hygiene measures surrounding the use of hand sanitisers for trips and a reminder that we have implemented regular handwashing as per the government guidance.

The Prime Minister has also stated that anyone developing coronavirus symptoms, however mild, such as a continuous cough or high temperature must now stay home for seven days. This will be the case for the school community and ask for your understanding with this if your children become ill and are asked to stay at home.

Preparations are taking in place in school, should we need to close in the future. If this happens, most of our communication with parents will be through our website and through ParentHub. I am asking parents and carers to ensure that they have given the school their most up-to-date email address and that you can ensure that you are able to access ParentHub. We will be monitoring the situation closely and will update you as soon as there are changes.
