Dear Parents and Carers,

As always, we hope that you are all happy, well and safe. Another week has just flown by. This newsletter is jam-packed with important updates so it might need a couple of reads just to soak up all the information.

September Opening

The question that we have all been asking has finally been answered! Yesterday, the DFE published their latest guidance regarding the return to school in September. The first line of this guidance stated,

'It is our plan that all pupils, in all year groups, will return to school full-time from the beginning of the autumn term.'

I'm sure that this will be a relief for many parents and children: to know that their children will be able to resume their education, meet up with friends and get back to a degree of normality. As parents, we will all have concerns about our children returning to school. Our job at Alford Primary, is now to plan and implement the detailed guidance issued to us – to create the safest possible environment that we can. This will take time to implement and time to ensure that all facets of the school are as safe as they can be. Over the next week, we will be working relentlessly to plan for this so that we can communicate our expectations for September. We anticipate changes and I'm sure you will have many, many questions. We will be producing a leaflet, which we hope will answer all these questions. This will be shared as soon as we can and certainly by the end of term.

Current EYFS- Y5 Transition Mornings.

The sign up for Transition Mornings has been fantastic. By now, you should have received an invitation detailing the day that your child is

invited to attend. We have organised these mornings to ensure that the groups are small enough to ensure social distancing can be adhered to. Unfortunately, due to this, the days cannot be changed. Just to recap — on the day-children can arrive any time between 8.45am and 9.15am. They should come to the doors stated on the Parent Hub message you received. Children can then be collected from the same place between 11.30am and 11.50am. If possible, please can all children bring in a sturdy plastic bag for taking home belongings and books.

EYFS, Year 1 and Year 6 Bubbles

These will close from Tuesday 14th July. After this, EYFS and Y1 children will only be coming in for their Transition Morning unless alternative arrangements have been made via the office.

Keyworker Bubbles

These Bubbles will also close from Tuesday 14th July.

A reminder to all that the children of Keyworkers who have booked to come in on Wednesday 15th July – Friday 17th July will not be with their usual Bubble adults. These children will need to be dropped off at the fire exit door to the main hall at 8.45am and collected at 3.15am. They will need to bring a packed lunch unless they have been receiving a lunch in school. We now have no more keyworker spaces available for Monday 20th July and Tuesday 21st July.

Reports

Your child's end-of-year report will be distributed on their Transition Morning. If your child is not attending the Transition Morning, it can be collected from the school office between 11am and 3pm on Monday 20th or Tuesday 21st July. Any reports not collected after this date will be posted to parents. Year 6 children who are attending the Secondary Transition Mornings on 8th and 9th July will be given their reports then. Any not collected will be posted.
