### Reporting Covid-19 over Christmas

Over the beginning of the Christmas holiday, the school will be on call for 6 days (up to 23rd December) should any children test positive. If your child does test positive within these 6 days (up to the 23rd December), we will need parents to notify us immediately. This can be done using the main school email primaryschool@alford.lincs.sch.uk.

Dates	18th December – 23rd December	24 <sup>th</sup> December – 3 <sup>rd</sup> January
What parents need to do	If your child tests positive during this time, immediately email the school at primaryschool@alford.lincs.sch.uk with the following information: • Child's full name • Child's date of birth • Child's class • Date that symptoms started • Date that COVID test was taken • Last day that child was in school	If your child tests positive during this time, <u>you do</u> <u>not need to inform the</u> <u>school until 4<sup>th</sup> January</u> . Your child will miss the beginning of the term as your child and household will be isolating.
What the school will do	Ring you and discuss the results. We will then trace contacts within the school community. We will inform children who need to self- isolate (contacts) via Parent Hub.	We will record your child as absent on return to school on Monday 4 <sup>th</sup> January. NHS Test and Trace will contact you.

If this occurs, we will be required by the DFE to 'Track and Trace' the close contacts of these children, which may mean contacting bubbles after the end of the holidays, and asking the children in these bubbles to self-isolate. This means that you may receive a Parent Hub message up to, and including the 23rd December. We obviously want to avoid this at all costs as this will mean that your child will then need to isolate and cannot leave the house for any reason.

The idea is for you and your child to create a Christmas Nativity scene in your window for everyone to see. Can you make a bed for Jesus? ### Jingle Bells


Please join us to jingle some bells at 6.00pm on Christmas Eve!

## Hope & Light - hope & wishes for 2021

A message to all the children....

On behalf of the Different Light team & East Lindsey District Council, I am just dropping you a line to say to say a massive thank you for getting involved in the Hope & Light project in Alford, Horncastle, Louth & Spilsby. We were delighted (and slightly overwhelmed!) to receive well over 1,000 designs from across the district and, as I hope you might have seen already, the projections and shopfront displays are up and running in all 4 towns (we even had a piece on BBC Look North) and will remain in place until New Years Day.

There is a final part to the project which is our Hopes & Wishes Tags. We are encouraging people across the district to collect a tag from a one of a few designated places in each of the 4 towns, to make a wish for 2021, to write that wish onto a tag (or just leave it blank if preferred) and then to tie the tags onto railings at the designated area in each town. In Spilsby & Horncastle this is around the main Christmas Tree, in Louth it's on some railings next to the main Christmas Tree and in Alford it's on the railings in front of the Manor House.

It's been a tough year for everyone and we imagine that everyone must have hopes for 2021 and it would be great to see the number of tags representing those hopes & wishes build up as we approach the New Year!
