COVID-19 CASES?

We have been incredibly fortunate to have had no members of the school community test positive since before Christmas.

The new regulations, from 19th July, do not require parents to inform the school of positive cases over the holiday. If your child tests positive, you will be contacted by Track and Trace. However, the whole family must still isolate!

In September, we have been told by the DFE that bubbles will no longer exist.

From 16th August, all children under 18 and adults who have had two vaccinations will not be required to isolate if they have been in contact with a confirmed case (unless they are a prolonged contact - e.g a household member). They will be asked to take a PCR test and, if negative, return to school.

NHS Track and Trace will be contacting families directly in these cases.

•Black, shoes - sensible for school (no trainers, heels, sandals, flashing lights or wheels!)

•Black, white or grey socks or tights.
