Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Your child will be learning;

to show resilience and perseverance when faced with a challenge.

how to express their own feelings and consider the feelings of others.

To further develop respectful relationships with their friends and familiar adults.

to continue to develop their independence with personal needs, e.g. (un)dressing and personal hygiene.

Communication and Language

Your child will be learning;

how to listen to and talk about stories, building familiarity and understanding.

how to re-tell stories, some as exact repetition and some in their own words.

how to express themselves through talk with confidence.

how to articulate their thoughts and ideas in well-formed sentences.

Physical Development

Your child will be learning;

to begin to know and talk about the different factors that promote their health and well-being, e.g. healthy eating, tooth brushing, good sleep.

to develop confidence and accuracy when engaging in activities that involve a ball e.g. throwing, catching, kicking, passing, batting and aiming.

to continue to develop their fine motor skills so that they can use a range of tools competently and safely.

Literacy

Your child will be learning;

to explore the alphabet and different letter groups and identify the sounds (phonemes) they make.

to use their sound knowledge to write words, lists and simple captions.

to develop a love of reading through our RED TED (Read Every Day, Talk Every Day) Reading Reward Scheme.

to use their sound knowledge to read short words and simple captions.

Mathematics

Your child will be learning;

the introduction of zero.

to compare numbers to five.

to explore the composition of 4 and 5.

to compare length, weight and capacity.

6, 7 and 8.

how to make pairs and combining two groups.

how to measure simple time.

Understanding of the World

Your child will be learning;

to continue to develop a school partnership with our friends at Grinling Gibbons Primary School in London.

To recognise some environments that are different to the one in which they live.

To compare environments around the world—hot and cold places.

Expressive Arts and Design

Your child will be learning;

To draw with increasing detail.

To play musical instruments with increasing control.

To develop storylines and narratives in their own play.

To put on puppet shows using a wide range of props to develop story language and imagination.

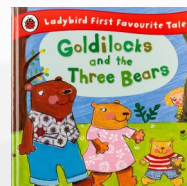
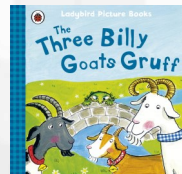
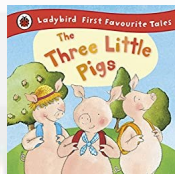
