The children began last week with the story of 'The King's Pants' – what an incredibly funny story about a king's many pairs of pants! Lots of their activities over the week were themed around

the Coronation. The children enjoyed learning how to make split pin soldiers, painted Union Jack flags, made their own Royal crowns and had lots of fun dressing up at King Charles and Queen Camilla!





Year 1

Year 1 are having great fun this term and are busy learning lots. At the start of the new term we had a Geography afternoon to learn about hot and cold places and the weather that is experienced all over the world. In English the children have learnt

about stories by studying Harry and the Bucketful of Dinosaurs. At the end of the unit of work, the children produced some super adapted versions of the story which were lovely for the teachers to read. In Maths the children have started to learn how to count in 2s, 5s and 10s as they explore larger numbers. In Computing, the children have started to use the Bee-Bots as part of our programming unit of work. The Year 1 children visited St Wilfrid's Church in Alford to learn about key features of a church as part of their learning in RE. much fun reading the

Year 3 had their book launch at the beginning of the term. The children had to go on a

Year 3 have begun their new history unit for the Summer term 'Ancient Egypt'. We spent a lesson learning about the earliest civilisations and then have began to focus in on Ancient Egypt. Each sheet was worth 100 years! They then compared durations and explored the Ancient Egyptian timeline a little further.


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Alford Wildlife Watch Programme 2023
