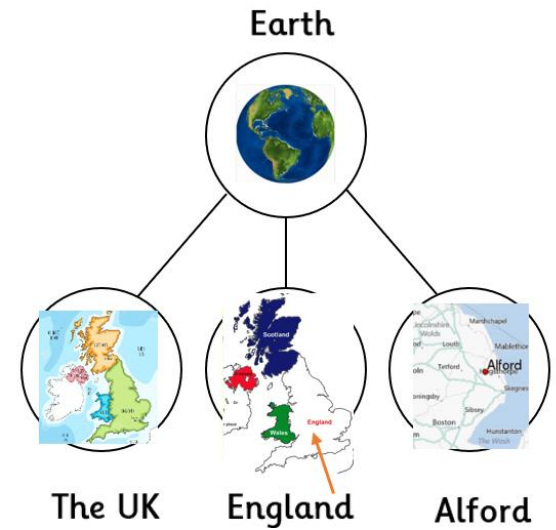


Y1 Geography: Our School, Our Town: Alford Knowledge Organiser

man-made	made by human beings
town	a place with many buildings and streets where people live and work. Bigger than a village
map	A flat drawing or photo of a place
environment	what is around us (human and physical features)
neighbourhood	part of a town where people live
directional language	Words used to describe where features are on a map
physical features	Natural things on the Earth or in a place
human features	Things made or built by human beings

Human Geography:

human feature, trim trail, secondary school, shops, library, windmill, St. Wilfrid's Church, Manor House, market square, neighbourhood, town
