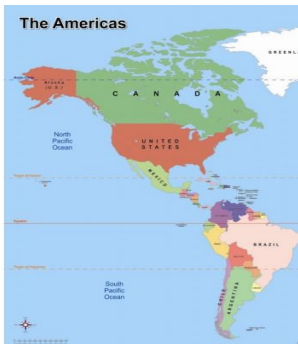
- I understand what is meant by human and physical geography.

Physical Geography

- The Northern Hemisphere is North of the Equator and the Southern Hemisphere is South of the Equator.
- A climate zone is an area of the planet with similar temperature and rainfall; the 5 major climate zones are polar, temperate, tropical, continental and desert.
- A biome is an area of the planet with similar climate, landscape, vegetation and wildlife; major land biomes include: forest, desert, grassland and tundra.

Human Geography

- North America is the third largest in size and second wealthiest continent in the world.
- South America is the fourth largest continent in the world and one of the poorest.

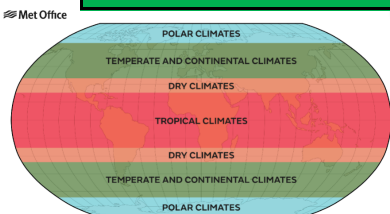

Comparing features of North and South America

NORTH AMERICA	SOUTH AMERICA
North America is the fourth largest in population, third largest in size and second wealthiest continent in the world, ranging from the Polar region in the North to the tropics in the south.	South America is the fourth largest continent in the world and one of the poorest; it is home to the largest river and rainforest in the world (the Amazon).
North America is largely made up of the USA, Canada and Mexico but also includes seven Central American countries.	South America is made up of 12 countries, the largest of which is Brazil.
