


- A compass is a piece of equipment that shows the directions North, East, South and West.

Physical Geography

Physical features of a coastline include:

 Bay headland, marsh, beach, dune, cave, cliff, arch, stack, stump and spit.



Human Geography

Human features of a coastline include:

 Shops, cafes, pier, harbour, promenade, groyne, sea wall, rock armour, lighthouse and wind farm.



Key Vocabulary

Sandy beaches

Our coastline has a large tidal range and wide sandy beaches which is ideal for tourism.
