In this enquiry, the children focus on what Christians may believe about God as the 'Father'. They focus on the Christian story of Creation from the Old Testament and the responsibility a Christian might feel for caring for the world, and the commandment to 'Love your neighbour as yourself' from the New Testament to understand how a Christian might feel about caring for other people.
